The Tour des Trees is an annual long-distance cycling adventure which serves as the primary public outreach and community engagement event for Tree Research and Education Endowment Fund (TREE Fund).

## New Data Provides Arlington Insight Into Health, Diversity of its Urban Forest

New data is helping the City of Arlington, which has nearly 100 parks, better understand the diversity of its urban forest and the potential risk from insect and disease threats to our native shade trees.



Last summer, the City conducted tree sampling in 44 of the 99 parks to determine and analyze tree density and the composition. The research found that 95 percent of the estimated 110,740 trees in the sampled parks were native trees, and that the three most common trees are sugarberry, post oak and cedar elm. This and other data gathered in the study will help guide the City in future tree planting decisions and has led to the creation of an interactive map that allows the public to view tree data by individual park.

### Settlement Reached in the 2011 Bastrop Fire Two lives, 34,000 acres and 1,700 homes

Four governing entities in Bastrop County have reached a \$5 million settlement with a tree-trimming company accused to have caused of the 2011 Complex Fire - the most destructive wildfire in Texas history.

The suit accused Asplundh Tree Expert Company of diverting crews away from a tree-trimming job along Bluebonnet Electric Cooperative power lines it was contracted to clear. Under extreme drought conditions, dry vegetation accumulated around Bluebonnet's easements, and when trees fell on power lines on Sept. 4, 2011, fires ignited.
