Wildfire Risk Assessment Qualification Course and Assessment

March 28-29, 2023 - in Austin

The threat wildfire poses to residents of Texas increases everyday as more people move into once natural areas. We know that it is not a question of if a fire will start, but when. As an ISA Certified Arborist, have you considered how your skills and experience can improve the safety and quality of tree care to protect Texans and ecosystems from wildfire? By taking the Wildfire Risk Assessment Qualification course, you will become more knowledgeable about how to evaluate and mitigate property from the threat wildfire poses.

The Texas A&M Forest Service and Texas Chapter ISA have developed this credential to introduce you to new terms and principles to incorporate into your arboriculture practice. You will explore how wildfire moves through a landscape and mitigation options you could perform or bring to the attention of your client. This course will be limited to 25 ISA Certified Arborists and we will conduct a field exercise on homes near the training center. A written exam and field test will need to be successfully passed to gain the credential. Total course time will be 16 hours, with four hours dedicated to the examination on Thursday afternoon.

May 19-20, 2023 in Austin



Volunteer Spotlight - Laura Miller

How long have you been in the tree care industry?

That is a great question. I graduated from Texas A&M University with a degree in horticulture in 1985. My two favorite classes were Dr. David Reed's Introduction to Horticulture—which he is still teaching!—and Dr. Benton Storey's Pecan Production class. Dr. Storey taught me how to prune to a central leader and manage a trashy trunk. I have been pruning ever since and in 1990 planted a small pecan orchard with several family members that we are still managing. My daughter is much more helpful now than she was as a one-year-old. One of my first horticulture jobs was propagating native plants in the Lower Rio Grande Valley for the Nature Conservancy. That included lots of thorny leguminous trees. In 2001, we moved to Florida for my husband's job, and I began working as an Extension Agent in the University of Florida system. My primary responsibility was working with the nursery industry in two counties. I had a chance to do some applied research at tree farms and enjoyed studying tree water use. I also had the opportunity to work with Dr. Ed Gilman regularly and learned a lot from him.

Why do you choose to give back by volunteering with ISAT?

I appreciate ISAT's commitment to continuing education and professionalism in arboriculture. I love to learn and like to share information with people who can put it to good use, and ISAT provides opportunities for me do both. The ISAT members that I get to interact with most often like Gene Gehring, Wendy Pappas, Gareth Harrier, AJ Thibodeaux, Mike Sills, Courtney Blevins, Sam Hill, Andrew Wimmel, Josh Goode, Keith Martin, and Jimmy Hoefert are all such nice people. It is a pleasure to work with them.

What has been your favorite aspect of being an arborist?

Everyone probably says this, but I love trees. I don't ever get tired of looking at them or thinking about them.

What's something interesting about you or something that no one knows about you?

I have admired trees in all 50 states. I highly recommend it.
