In this workshop, Chris Luley, Ph.D. (President, Urban Forest Diagnostics, LLC) discusses fungal identification, biology and life cycles. He also explains how different decay organisms interact with their host. Frank Rinn, inventor of the RESISTOGRAPH and ARBOTOM (Owner, RINNTECH) discusses tree biology and biomechanics, and how breaking forces act on trees in various states of decay.

## Texas to Receive \$21.75 Million in Federal Funding for Urban Forestry Initiatives for 2023

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has awarded Texas A&M Forest Service \$21.75 million for projects that will expand and conserve forests in the state's urban areas.

The funding, part of the Biden administration's **Inflation Reduction Act**, will help Texas expand its urban forest canopy, improve air and water quality, reduce energy consumption, and enhance the health and well-being of communities.

#### **Volunteer Spotlight - Kari Hines**

Tell us a little about yourself: How'd you get to work at TFS, what do you do in the tree care industry, and how long have you been in the industry?

After graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Forestry from Northern Arizona University I received a full-time position with Texas A&M Forest Service as an Inventory Forester, which literally had me hugging trees for two years. I loved being able to interact with landowners and discussing land management, ecology, tree health, etc., so when a position opened in another local office to do wildfire preparedness and prevention outreach, I jumped on that opportunity. While I received certified arborist certification fairly quickly after joining the Mitigation and Prevention Department almost 9 years ago, my "tree industry" work is very informal and mostly just me taking the opportunity to include natural resource information to audiences interested in wildfire preparedness.

In what capacities do you volunteer with ISAT and why do you choose to volunteer with ISAT? How did you become instrumental in WRRQ?

I am certainly not your typical volunteer. As I joked with Megan when she asked if this feature could be done, I am doing the work with the Texas Chapter as an employee of an agency, not on my free time. I feel like an imposter calling myself a volunteer. But, if you qualify that descriptor as "volunteering to teach a class," then yes, it fits. I have been involved with the Wildfire Risk Reduction Qualification since before it had that name and we were trying to figure out what a good acronym would be. As someone who has a "formal" (re: education) background in natural resources and wildfire, and who also doesn't mind speaking in front of crowds, a peer asked if I could help rework an old program on wildfire preparedness for an arborist audience, which of course just meant that the two people who were trying to do it were already involved in too many things and needed assistance. Mark Kroeze, in our Urban and Community Forestry program, and I, spent countless hours updating graphics from the early 2000's, adding in new content, going through the alpha and two beta classes, and working with Paul Johnson to get ISA's seal of approval for CEU's. We've been teaching it since 2017 and have now taken it to 4 other Southern Region states in an attempt to get the regionally appropriate ISA chapter and that state forestry agency working together to teach the class to arborists in other places.

When you're not busy working, what other hobbies do you enjoy?

Of course I enjoy being outside, that should go without saying in this group. I'm not a very exciting person, no rock-climbing, white-water rafting or triathelons. Most of my free time is spent raising a daughter, spending time with family and friends, and attempting to keep a clean house. We play dice games with our neighbors on Friday nights and watch 6-year-olds play soccer ball on Saturday mornings. As a family we've had about 100 foster dogs and a few dozen kittens over the last 8 years, which mostly means that I'm sabotaging the "trying to keep the house clean" part of my daily struggles.
